Impact of PPG spending 2018-19

The attainment of our pupils in receipt of the PPG at the end of Key Stage One was above that of their non-PPG peers in reading, broadly in line in writing, and below in maths. The attainment of our pupils in receipt of the PPG at the end of Key Stage Two was above that of their non-PPG peers.

In 2018-19 the progress of our pupils in receipt of the PPG was broadly in line, and in many instances above, that of their non-PPG peers in Years 1-6. The attainment of pupils in receipt of the PPG across the school is, broadly speaking, below that of their peers.

- To improve progress in reading (including phonics), writing and maths to close any gap between the attainment of pupils in receipt of PPG and other pupils.
- To provide enriching experiences and enhance self-esteem and self-discipline for more able pupils.
- To allow PPG pupils to have a safe outlet to express their feelings.
- To improve attendance and punctuality of PPG pupils.
