Impact of PPG spending 2017-18

The attainment of our pupils in receipt of the PPG at the end of Key Stage One was below that of their non-PPG peers. The attainment of our pupils in receipt of the PPG at the end of Key Stage Two was below that of their non-PPG peers. Attainment of our PPG pupils in Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling at greater depth was above that of their non-PPG peers at the end of Key Stage Two.

In 2017-18 the progress of our pupils in receipt of the PPG was either above or broadly in line with that of their non-PPG peers in Years 1-6.

- To improve attendance and punctuality of PPG pupils.
