#### **PE Kit**



The Summer Reading Challenge is a national scheme produced by the Reading Agency and delivered by public libraries that encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays – and to enjoy anything they like to read! Children aged 4-11 are invited to take part and collect rewards for their reading, giving them a positive experience of reading for pleasure.

It's **FREE** to take part. Sign your child up at <a href="https://www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src">www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src</a> You can ask a one of our volunteers or a member of staff for help if you need it.

The Challenge will begin in <u>East Sussex libraries</u> on Saturday 5th July and end on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> September.

The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from our <u>ebook library</u>. For children under 4 we have the Pre-school Challenge, where you can collect stickers for each book shared and a special medal sticker at the end.

Children signing up for the Challenge get a character sticker and a Reader Record. Children will be able to collect a prize for each of the six books they have read. When they finish the Challenge they will get a certificate which they can receive in school or at the library. The Challenge is for all children, whatever their reading ability. Children who are not reading independently can share their books with a family member or friend, or they might prefer to listen to audio books.

To take part in **Story Garden** children need to have their own library card and PIN. It is easy and free to become a member of the library. Take something with your name, address and signature to the library and you can join the whole family. You can <u>reset your child's PIN online</u> if you can't remember it, or ask in the library for a new one. You will need the PIN to sign up to the Challenge
