Parent/Carer Survey Feedback - July 2025

Thank you so much to everyone who completed our parent/carer survey at the end of last term. We received 23 responses in total, roughly 10% of our school community, which we've summarised below. In areas where we didn't score as highly, we'll be reflecting on the feedback and considering what changes we can implement to further improve the school experience for our children and their families.

100% of parents and carers agree:

- their child is happy
- their child is safe
- their child does well
- children behave well
- the school deals effectively with bullying (over 70% responded that it hasn't been a problem at all).
- the school is a welcoming and pleasant place
- the school is well led and managed
- 17 out of 23 said the school has high expectations of their child
- 19 out of 23 said the school makes them aware what their child is learning
- 20 out of 23 said the school lets me know what is going on
- 19 out of 23 said there is a good range of subjects available

What are the best bits?

- Supportive environment and child-centred learning
- I like that there are staff members greeting parents at the beginning and end of the day.
- Staff are approachable. I love OPAL too!
- How everyone is included and as a parent I am kept up to date with everything.
- The children have adults in school who they trust and who make them feel like they really
 matter. The teacher's updates and weekly snapshots help us feel connected to what's going
 on.
- There's a real sense of community at the school, which makes it a lovely place for the children and families.
- The play opportunities and involvement we get as parents and carers.
- It feels like a family.
- The community feel and the fact that it is small I think the children are seen more. OPAL is a
 great scheme.
- Happy children and a nice community.
- The teachers are very welcoming and take care of the kids which make them feel safe.
- Our son feels safe and enjoys his day at school and that is down to the staff and activities.
 Opportunities to go into the school and be with/see our son. Like sports day, stay and play, assemblies etc and having enough notice so can take the time off work to come. Doing parents race on sports day!
- We are so happy with Denton, there is a real buzz about the place and lots of exciting things going on.

What could we improve?

"K\$1 playground desperately needs a scooter storage area, so many getting damaged and squashed into where they currently go near the entrance, so hard to get my child's out at pick up time"

"As parents we haven't got to meet the teacher for the next year. I know the kids have done a meet the teacher but it would be nice as parents to meet them too so we know who is going to be looking after our child."

"Having a music specialist and wider range of PE activities."

Offering a wider range of subjects with more visiting teachers and making sure more able students are stretched"



We already do or will do soon...

We've applied for some grants to support with the costs and are currently looking into options for these to be installed on each playground without it removing space for the children to play in.

All families have had the opportunity to come and meet their child's teacher this week. Class teachers are available for a phone call or meeting at the parents request. Many of the teachers are on the playground in the mornings and all teachers are available at pick up.

We are committed to ensuring our children have their full curriculum which is enhanced with lots of aditional enrichment opportunities. We've got some exciting events planned in terms 1 and 2 which we will be writing to families about shortly.

We're committed to creating a school culture where every child feels seen, valued, and respected — regardless of background. This includes:

Broadening representation in our curriculum, books, and displays **Celebrating diversity** through themed weeks, assemblies, and cultural events

Encouraging empathy and global awareness through PSHE and wider learning

Listening to pupil and parent voice to ensure all perspectives are considered

This continues to be a priority for the school but also a real challenge. We continue to have a breakfast club on site via Sports Cool which runs Monday to Friday. There is also Nippers who offer after school childcare. In next weeks newsletter we will share with families our offer of after school enrichment clubs.

In July we consulted with our staff and children and **updated** our Teaching and Learning policy to reflect our **high expectations** for behaviour which always include clear consequences. Our approach to supporting behaviour is in line with East Sussex and national guidance. Our Ofsted report praised the behaviour of the children and the way it is managed in school.







We are looking forward to seeing you at our Open Evening, where we will offer visitors the opportunity to tour our school, visit a variety of departments, meet staff and see the numerous resources and facilities we have available at Seaford Head School.

We will be making three presentations through the course of the evening; at 5.00pm, 6.00pm, and 7.00pm. This allows parents/carers to have a tour of the school and visit the different departments before or after the presentations.


