Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand how they can keep themselves safe. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult (e.g. parent or teacher) or Childline. This programme is recommended to schools as part of their ongoing safeguarding support they provide to the children.



This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of an age-appropriate virtual assembly and supporting classroom-based activity which we have

reviewed, alongside a NSPCC volunteer who will lead a face to face workshop for years 2, 5 & 6. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot 'Buddy'.

Parents and carers are asked to let their child's teacher know if their child may have experienced anything (in the past or happening now) which may mean they need extra support before, during or after taking part in this programme.
