Parent Governor Vacancy

We are writing to inform you of a vacancy for the role of Parent Governor on our governing board. We are looking for an enthusiastic and dedicated parent who is keen to play a role in helping the school run effectively, working as part of a team alongside our wonderful governing board, the headteacher, and school staff to ensure Denton remains a happy and safe learning environment that provides excellent education for all children.

The role of the governing board

The school's governing board is responsible for ensuring that the school has a clear vision, ethos, and strategic direction. Governors hold the leadership team to account for the educational performance of the school and its children, and they oversee the financial performance of the school to ensure its money is well spent. The board is passionate about education and committed to continuous improvement to achieve the best possible outcomes for our children.

The role of a Parent Governor

As a Parent Governor, you will work with the board to ensure it effectively carries out the duties described above. You will also play a vital role in bringing a parental perspective to the governing board, although you are not there to speak on behalf of the parent body.

To be a Parent Governor, you should have:

- A strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children
- Good interpersonal skills, curiosity, and a willingness to learn and develop new skills
- The specific skills needed to help the governing board deliver effective governance

We would be particularly interested in candidates with any of the following desirable (but not essential) skills or experience:

- Links with local businesses
- Financial planning or management experience
- Premises and facilities management experience
- Experience of serving on a board
- Procurement or purchasing experience
- Knowledge of the local/regional economy

Expectations of governors

Governors are expected to attend regular meetings (usually six per academic year), visit the school at least twice per academic year, commit to training, and be willing to take on a Link Governor role. The term of office is four years. New governors must undertake a full DBS check before their term begins.

If you are interested in applying, please complete the candidate form attached to the newsletter and return it to Amanda Townsend (Clerk to the Governors) at clerk@denton.e-sussex.sch.uk by **Friday 27th February**. If we receive more applications than there are vacancies, a ballot will be held. We will inform you nearer the time if this becomes necessary.
